

## Alamo Lake Campout

Thursday April 6<sup>st</sup> - Sunday April 9<sup>th</sup> Alamo Rd, Wenden, AZ 85357

Alamo Lake State Park is one of the best places to fish for bass in Arizona. The crystal clear lake is surrounded by mountainous terrain speckled with brush, wildflowers and cacti making for a visually pleasing experience. The park has good wildlife viewing opportunities, and you may spot a bald or golden eagle. Stargazers are sure to enjoy the amazing views of the night sky with the nearest city lights some 40 miles away!

The Group Camp #2, which is located next to Alamo Lake, has one Ramada, one large barbeque grill, vault toilets, fire pit & plenty of places to set up your camp. Restrooms with flush toilets, RV dump, fish cleaning station & showers are nearby at **Camp Area C**.

Arrive anytime after  $1_{pm}$  on Thursday. Follow the directions below to get to the group area.

On Saturday at 4:30 pm, we will start grilling burgers & chicken for dinner. Social at the Ramada begins about 4pm. **Dessert will be provided**. Please bring an appetizer to share.

Remember to bring food, drinking water, hiking gear, swimming attire and firewood. Quiet time is from 10 pm until 6 am. Your moderately behaved dogs are welcome.

**Directions:** Get to Wenden (33.8226956,-113.5413674). Head NW on 2<sup>nd</sup> St. As you approach The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints on the right, the road will curve N and become Alamo Rd. After approximately 32.8 miles, turn right onto Cholla Rd. In less than a mile, you will pass **Camp Area C**. 1.5 miles after you turn onto Cholla, turn left into the Group Camp #2. The store carries fishing and camping items like fishing licenses, boating supplies (boating flags, life jackets, boat cushions, ropes, anchors, battery clamps, etc.), and firewood. They also have park specific items like shirts and hats, patches, walking sticks, pins, books, and more. In addition, they offer a line of souvenir items. Food items for sale include ice cream, soda, water, milk, eggs, canned vegetables, candy bars, condiments, hot dogs & buns, marshmallows & graham crackers, personal hygiene items, and more.
